

A lady in the village wanted an explanation why the grass verge on the corner of the Lutton to Sledmere road has not been cut properly.

Mr McDonald stated that the 30mph sign on the back lane from East Lutton had been knocked down by a grass cutter and needed re-erecting.

A lady stated that the path in Helperthorpe was over grown and covered in horse droppings and suggested that people given community orders should clear them. Also raised there was no footpath between Helperthorpe and East Lutton Rydale to be contacted.

Mr Wayne stated that the points raised in his letter had not been answered and the year end counts had not been properly signed off and indicated that the chair had lied when signing them off and said he had taken the matter to the next stage, the chair was very upset by this and said she would take this to the next stage and Mr Wayne would not like the consequences. Mr Wayne asked why he would not like the consequences, was it a threat.

Mr McDonald asked now that every councillor had the council tool kit what did they intend to do with it.

The Clerk replied that he had hoped every councillor would read it, inwardly digest and act on it accordingly. He also stated that traffic coming to East Lutton, Helperthorpe and Butterwick had an average speed 30mph before action on speed levels could be taken.

Mr McDonald also stated that a grant of £6205 by the landfill communities fund had been obtained and that hopefully the church wall reconstruction should commence around about Christmas.
