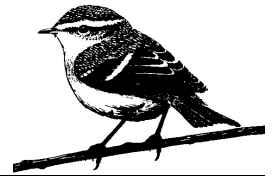

School holidays are now upon us and typically the heavens open! It is, of course, lovely to have the children home all day although the novelty can soon start to wear thin. As a father of three, I speak from experience! The greatest challenge for us parents is to encourage our technology-dependent children into making the most of the extraordinary countryside which surrounds us.

Next week, at our Council meeting, we will be debating whether or not to offer up part of Wentworth Street car park for sale. This is a highly contentious issue which has polarised opinion and there are compelling arguments on all sides. Rather unusually for me, I find myself sitting on the fence at present with my mind not fully made up. I am tending to the view that, provided that sufficient car parking space is retained, then it might be foolish to pass up the opportunity of realising an asset, the proceeds of which could help fund some extremely critical projects (A64 junction improvements; flood defences). Importantly, I still harbour an ambition of establishing an Enterprise Centre or High-tech industrial park in the Malton area. With swingeing cuts in the offing, it is important to ensure that we have something in reserve in order to see us through these stormy waters.

Finally, would anyone who thinks that they might be interested in becoming a District Councillor please get in touch with me. Elections are due to be held in May next year and we are always on the lookout for suitable candidates. Weaverthorpe Parish Council

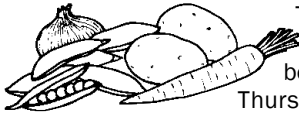
Weaverthorpe Parish Council met on 19th July 2010, the minutes are available to view on the Luttons and Weaverthorpe web site.

English Heritage has put a great deal of money into St Andrew's, Weaverthorpe, and Baroness Andrews is keen to see the church itself and to hear about fresh ideas for its use by the whole community. All welcome.

MOCK TRIAL at the Church.

Friday 17th September 2010

The children of Weaverthorpe School will be using lesson-time to discover what happens at a criminal trial, by taking all the parts themselves! except those of the judge and counsel for the prosecution and defence, which will be taken by Cathy Otton-Goulder QC. The mock trial will take place in the church, which will have been used for trials in the Middle Ages. All the children will have the chance to put on a barrister's wig, and to ask questions about the legal system; appropriate sentencing; alternatives to prison; and the roles of the lawyers, probation and prison officers, journalists, court staff and others involved in the criminal justice system. Children and teachers are welcome to photograph or video the session. Since it is a school lesson, parents cannot be invited to be present during the session, but they are warmly encouraged to consider with their children what questions they would like to ask. Parents are welcome to collect their children from the church at the end of the afternoon, at 3.15 pm

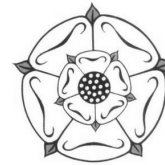
Dear Dog Owners (2)

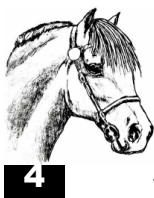
