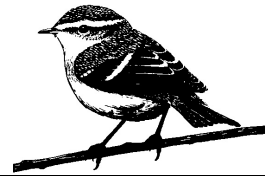

A View from Ryedale House

Since my last column, the 'Wentworth Street car park' debate has sparked both controversy and vociferous public involvement. By a majority, the Council voted to sell it and, in so doing, hopes to raise a significant sum which it intends to put towards existing and deserving community projects across Ryedale. For my part, I ploughed a lonely furrow within my political group, voting against a sale. I believed the decision to be short-sighted and I have real difficulty in coming to terms with yet another supermarket in Malton. However, democracy prevails; the vote has been taken and we must now do everything to ensure, via the planning process, that we minimise the potential impact on our existing retail providers.

At long last, we have given the green light for the funding of an improved A64 junction at Brambling Fields (the Norton end of the bypass) which should have positive environmental and economic consequences. The annual process of setting the budget has begun and, in common with the country at large, will inevitably mean 'cuts.' Once again, our duty is to strive to maintain priority services whilst keeping council tax as low as humanly possible. There are going to be some tough decisions ahead.

I have been asked about plastic and cardboard recycling. I am confident that the Council will begin to roll out the pilot scheme to the rest of Ryedale (including the Wolds) over the next 9-12 months. I am also keeping a watchful eye on developments vis a vis planned wind farms. I am acutely conscious of the emotion, let the alone amount of energy, that they generate!

Events at Dalby Forest

COLOURFUL, WILD AND FREE IN DALBY FOREST!

With Autumn colours set to spread across the region the Forestry Commission has named North Yorkshire's top five places to see the riot of rustic hues.

Dalby Forest, near Pickering, Kilburn Woods, near Thirsk, Bishopwood near Cawood, are all prime spots say forest chiefs, along with Newgate Bank north of Helmsley and Ingleby Greenhowe, near Stokesley, included for their fabulous viewpoints over breathtaking countryside.

To mark the turning of the seasons the Forestry Commission is opening Dalby Forest for free on **Wednesday 27 October**. The normal forest toll will be suspended for the day, offering a great chance to view the colours, saddle up for a bike ride, or even go fungi spotting in what is proving a great year for mushrooms and toadstools.

Adderstone Field Parking Area

During 2010 extensive works were undertaken at Adderstone Field to create an area of hard standing parking which will be able to be used in the winter months.

Cyclists wishing to start the Red and Green Cycle routes or use Dixons Hollow can rest assured that there will be plenty of parking available which will be useable in all weathers.

New walks unveiled for Dalby Forest.

2010 saw the unveiling of 3 new way-marked walking routes at Dalby Forest.

Sneverdale Rigg Rabbit Run (2 miles).

A pleasant walk from the Visitor Centre with the chance that you may see deer at the viewpoint. The walk takes you past a 'rabbit type', an important part of the history of Dalby area when rabbits were farmed for fur.

Jerry Noddle Viewpoint (2 miles return).

Follow the forest road to Jerry Noddle for spectacular views over the upper Langdale Valley. Return on the same route.

Jerry Noddle Trail (2.8 miles).

Follow this circular trail and be rewarded with spectacular views at Jerry Noddle over the Upper Langdale Valley.
