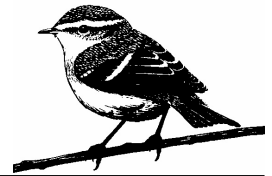

A View from Ryedale House



In April I wrote about apprenticeship initiatives that we have been nurturing and supporting across the district for some time now. It seems that those efforts are beginning to bear fruit. Latest unemployment figures show Ryedale's almost 11% down on May 13 compared with a national district average of just under 4%. Good news but, as always, no cause for complacency.

I was relieved to see the West Heslerton windfarm proposal turned down. As far as I was concerned this was never an argument about renewable energy but all about preserving, for future generations, an historic and precious landscape. The scale, presence and blade movement of ten alien 126ft high turbines would have drawn the eye, dwarfed and dominated the area for miles around and blighted an extraordinary and stunning landscape immortalised by, amongst others, David Hockney, arguably our greatest living artist.

Finally, I am delighted to see that Duggleby awarded a Council grant to support its 'green-fingered' community garden. If any other community-based organisation or group needs financial support in order to realise a local community initiative (maybe a play area; village shop or sports facility), then it is well worth applying to the District Council for an allocation from its Community Grant Fund. 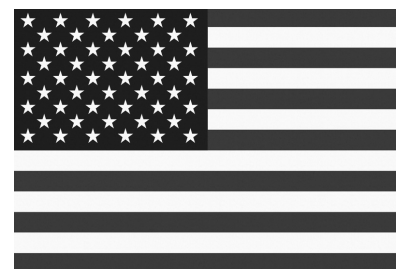

own home. The service is particularly useful for
those who may be disabled, or who may find
mobility difficult, and is also available for carers
benefiting both the carer and the person they
care for. Customers can join the scheme on a
temporary or permanent basis. This can be ideal
especially during the winter months when getting
out and about may be difficult.

The service is FREE and, initially, being offered to
residents in Butterwick, Weaverthorpe,
Helperthorpe, and the Luttons. If you are
