A View from County Hall



I am going to touch on a couple of big broad issues this month and though they may seem very distant from our everyday life, they none the less affect us all.

Firstly, landfill tax costs us £80 a tonne – that's rubbish to you and I. It all has to go somewhere and from a time long before I was elected to NYCC, we have been considering alternatives to landfill because it is both costly and more to the point, not the best environmentally friendly way to dispose of our waste. On the 24th September, at an extraordinary meeting, we will be voting on a decision to build an incinerator at Allerton Park. It's a hugely complex, controversial and finely balanced decision which promises an interesting debate.

I have followed the issue of child sexual exploitation (CSE) in Rotherham with absolute abhorrence. The findings of the Jay report are disturbing not least because we are told this is a national issue. Back in June we were thrust into an OFSTED inspection for services dealing with vulnerable children. The outcome was "Good" all-round placing us as one of the top authorities in the country. The inspection recognised the work undertaken to combat CSE through a strategy emphasising the importance of a multi-faceted approach. It's an unpalatable thought that the apparently unthinkable is now part of our culture, however in recognising this; we must all ensure that our young people are listened to and taken seriously however difficult this may be.

'The Songman' from the National Theatre's production of Michael Morpurgo's 'Warhorse' comes to Burton Fleming

NorthWolds Arts & Music is a new enterprise set up by former professional musician Al Best, to bring top class arts and music to small village halls and churches across the rural areas of East Yorkshire's North Wolds.

The aim is to create performing arts experiences, not normally available to smaller communities, in the settings of village halls, churches and other small venues. On offer will be interactive hands on experiences, workshops, concerts, exhibitions and other events designed to enrich rural life. The first of what is hoped to be many of such events, sees eminent singer and guitarist Bob Fox in concert at Burton Fleming Village Hall.

"Our first concert is on Oct 5th and we have cherry-picked an artist who was the 'Songman' in the National Theatre's production of Michael Morpurgo's 'Warhorse' in the West End" explained Al Best, "he has also been nominated twice as 'Best Folk Singer' in the BBC Folk Awards and I know he will put on an excellent show." Al went on to say, "This first event is a toe in the water to see what response we get and if all goes well we will be forging ahead with our 2015 programme much of which is already pencilled in."
