The most notable event that has taken place over the last month is probably the weather and it's after effects. Over the festive season heavy rain which caused major flooding issues for all the main rivers also affected the Gypsy Race.

Here in Duggleby where I live, the sheer volume of water passing through the Gypsy Race caused localised flooding and I have already had discussions with representatives of North Yorkshire County Council including the flood risk team, Highways who are responsible for the culverts that pass under the roads and Yorkshire Water.

As a result I hope to be able to attend all the Wolds Parish Council meetings to find out what other areas have also been affected with flooding issues and to see what measures might be taken address the problem. To that end I would be interested in hearing from any local residents that have been affected by flooding as well.

To compound matters, snow has arrived and when this eventually starts to melt, with the ground so waterlogged, further localised flooding cannot be ruled out.

Changing the topic to what appears to be most residents' complaints, 'fast broadband', just as LN Communications began to discuss with residents the introduction of a wireless network with the aid of government funding, the funding pot put in place by the chancellor that was meant to last until April 2016 ran out at the beginning of October. Unfortunately this was not replenished during the Autumn statement so that initiative came to a very abrupt halt,

On the good news side the residents of Wharram Le Street now have access to super-fast broadband with speeds up to 330 MB. On the practical side I have met up with NYNET/SFNY and also been in contact with our local MP Kevin Hollinrake. During this quarter, SFNY will be mapping out those areas in North Yorkshire that currently do not have access to fast broadband. This is in readiness for the start of Phase 3 of the fast broadband roll out which is intended to start this May and complete sometime in 2018.

When I know more about which areas within the Wolds are to be covered by phase 3 and the likely time line, I will advise.

Finally with respect to better mobile coverage as a whole, it would be easier to wade through treacle. Part of the issue is where one operator can provide decent coverage they are not obliged to share their network with competitors. This is an issue that needs to be addressed by central government. Another area of delay is the length of time taken to obtain the permission from landowners to allow for masts to be erected on their property.


