

## Recycling Collections

At the Annual Meeting of Weaverthorpe Parish Council asked if anything could be done about the amount of paper and plastic that blows around the village on recycling day.

I have contacted Ryedale District Council and they confirm that lids or nets can be requested from them to fit on to the recycling boxes. You can contact RDC by telephoning 01653 600666 and ask for Streetscene or email them at [streetscene@ryedale.gov.uk](mailto:streetscene@ryedale.gov.uk) They also have a limited number of 40 litre blue boxes for paper if you existing blue bag is not sufficient for your needs.

Meanwhile RDC offer a few tips for recycling day: squash the plastic bottles and if you have not got a lid or net put the black box for glass or blue bag for paper on top of the green box containing the plastic always ensure you use the Velcro tab on the blue bag to stop the paper blowing out of the bag

is to be maintained.

notice boards. All council meetings are held in Kirby  
Grindalythe Village Hall. Members of the public are

Chromebooks. Luttons School has received  
the Chromebooks as part of a bid with a  
cluster of schools which work together to  
improve learning and social skills of students,  
as well as support and professional  
development of staff. The Children will be  
able to produce pieces of work on the devices  
and, with the Wi-Fi connection, their teacher  
will be able to give feedback to them as they  
type. What's more children from different  
schools will be able to interact in lessons,  
providing peer assessment and working

The use of modern technology in a rural

### Support and friendship for families

Home-Start Ryedale is a  
local charity that provides  
support to families who  
have at least one child  
under the age of 5 and who  
are experiencing a whole  
range of different  
challenges in their daily  
lives. These may include  
being socially isolated, having physical or mental  
health difficulties in the family, having housing issues  
or struggling with routines within the family home.  
Families can refer themselves to our service, or can  
be referred by health visitors or any other agency.  
Home-Start Ryedale can match a family with a  
volunteer who will provide 2 hours a week of support  
and friendship, tailored to suit the individual needs of  
the family.

We have recently been awarded money from the Big  
Lottery fund with the remit of extending our service  
into Southern Ryedale (areas South of the A64  
between Foxholes and out towards Sand Hutton) to  
support families. We are really keen to get our  
service better known in these areas so that families  
know about the support that may be available to  
them.

We also want to recruit new volunteers to help with  
our expansion into Southern Ryedale. We look for  
volunteers from all ages and walks of life - the only  
common thing is that volunteers have parenting  
experience themselves, which enables them to  
empathise with the families about the early parenting  
years. Being a Home-Start volunteer is a hugely  
rewarding experience and can bring about positive  
change for young families in the local area.
