A View from County Hall



Anyone got election fatigue! Or Council confusion? Parliamentary elections, Parish councils, District councils, County council, referendums, Brexit. That's before we even start to think about the Police and Fire authority and the Police Crime Commissioner. When your faced with a problem, don't you just want to pick up the phone or go on line and get your problem solved in the quickest and most efficient manner.

10 years ago, NYCC brought together 130 separate telephone numbers into one single Customer Service Centre. In those early days, there were around 2,000 calls a day. Today the centre deals with around 2,500 enquiries a day, but only about 1,000 are by telephone. Emails, web chat and social media make up the balance. This has enabled a revolutionary change to Children's Social Services where the MAST (Multi Agency Screening Team) now includes professionals from a range of authorities including Social Care, Health and Police.

The potential for wider service delivery, especially to our small rural villages is obvious but it can't work without full coverage of the communication infrastructure to support it. At the moment I can only dream of the day where there is one point of contact for all authorities, but I do live in hope.
