## A View from County Hall



Two items have been dominating County Council news, the budget and the weather. At our recent budget meeting, we agreed to increase council tax by 4.99% which includes the ring fenced 1.99% for social care. There is no doubt that Local Government is under enormous strain, compounded in part by the pressures of an increasingly aging population and an increase by a third since 2014 in children with special educational needs and disabilities. The bottom line is that we need to make £44m of savings over the next three years. We have plans in place to save £33m, leaving a financial hole of £10m. The pressures we face are national pressures and I am sure we have all seen and hold in mind the plight of Northamptonshire County Council who face dire financial problems and have taken very drastic measures, suspending all non-urgent funding. We have been working with our MPs to lobby government for a fairer deal and welcomed the news just before our budget meeting that the final position from Government on the grant that NYCC will receive next year was improved by around £3m.

During these difficult times, it is essential that our small Wolds villages maintain strong representation and good lines of communication. We saw this in action after the collapse of Stevenson's bus service which provided school transport and the valuable 190 service. No commercial operator came forward to replace the 190 service, we know the importance of this provision to its users and so the county council has now picked up the running of this service. Please note the amended timetable.

Finally to the weather, I was called out to do an interview with Harry Gratonsnow deep in the middle of Thornton Le Dale. We can't clear all roads, but our priority routes were kept open and for the most part, services maintained. We must have got this right because the feedback I received from the interview made no comment on service provision, only my choice of hat!

### WEAVERTHORPE PARISH COUNCIL

#### Commons Land Registration

The Commons Registration Act of 1965 did not require the registers of common land and village greens to be kept up to date. There is however a deadline if Parish Councils want to register any common land or village greens, under the above Act. This has to be carried out before 14 December 2018.

In the village of Weaverthorpe we have three pieces of land that the Parish Council think should be registered. They are the land directly in front of Wesley Cottage (known as the Methodist car park) excluding the south east corner of that land, the land on which the War Memorial is situated and the Village Green (the piece of green area between the Blue Bell and the Star Inn. The Parish Council have agreed that we should register these three pieces of land.

Ryedale District Council are currently applying to the Planning Inspector to register the strip of green land that runs along the south side of Main Road all the way through the village as a Visually Important Undeveloped Area (VIUA). That strip includes the Village Green, but does not include the other two pieces of land mentioned above. The view from RDC is that this will not get the Planning Inspector's approval until some time in 2019. Weaverthorpe Parish Council have asked that the additional pieces of land be registered as VIUAs, but we will not know whether this has happened until 2019.

The Parish Council therefore intend to register all the land mentioned above, including the long thin strip, as Common Land, therefore preventing any development on that land and protecting it for the future.

If any resident has any objections to what we are proposing would you please contact the Parish Council by the end of April 2018, giving your grounds for objection.

The second one is located outside Bannister's Farm Shop, Butterwick, funded by the parish council with contributions from George Bairstow Charitable Trust, T Bannister and B&F Potatoes Ltd.

The parish council wishes to thank all those who assisted with the funding of these two defibrillators for the benefit of local residents.

A number of local volunteers have been trained on how to use it. However if you have not received this training in an emergency call "999" in the normal way and if the emergency requires the use of a defibrillator, the Ambulance Service will provide the code to unlock the defibrillator and provide instructions over the phone on how to use it if necessary.
