On a local basis the collaboration between Parish Councils that have the Gypsy Race running through their villages and whose aim is the management of the beck in order to reduce the incidence of flooding had its first meeting which was chaired by John Wane of West Luttons Parish Council.

Highways has been carrying out road works which has been mainly the surface dressing of local roads. However, in some cases where they have notified the closure of roads in order to carry out the remedial work this has not been undertaken. This disruption and lack of communication has only led to the annoyance of local residents. The official Highways stance has been that either existing works have overrun affecting their maintenance time table and or owing to priorities they have had to redeploy resources elsewhere and would return at an unspecified time in the future. This lack of communication is not acceptable from a government department serving the public and I am endeavouring to obtain information from Highways as to when the planned works will ultimately be carried out. If and when I am able to find out more information I will advise the relevant Parish Council.

As previously reported the village was successful in its bid to the British Heart Foundation, for a defibrillator at no cost to the Parish Council.

The defibrillator is now up and running, being located on the east wall of the Blue Bell Inn. It is registered with Yorkshire Ambulance Service who, on receipt of a call from the village gives the code to access the machine.

Training for volunteers from the village organisations will take place soon and will be advertised in a future edition of the Warbler.
