## A View from Ryedale House



It is said that a week is a long time in politics and these feels like an extended marathon. The county council elections are now over and we have the general election to contend with. During this period, it would have been expected that events at Ryedale District Council would have been relatively quiet, however, 6 elected Conservative councillors decided to leave the party and join the exiting Independent councillors. Whilst the Conservative group at Ryedale Council is still the largest group, the independents now make up the second largest group and there will now need to be more co-operation between the various groups which is a positive outcome.

Ryedale District Council has started the new financial year with a new chairman William Oxley from Pickering East Ward. However, this year there will be not be a single group leader from the Conservative party and the duties will be shared amongst two of the members. For my part I will be moving from the Overview and Scrutiny Committee to the Planning Committee.

The outgoing chairman of Ryedale District Council Bob Gardiner ran a competition for village halls with three categories of equal standing as he believes that village halls play a vital part within the community. I am delighted to say that the award for the champion village hall committee went to the Thixendale Village Hall Committee and was there for the presentation.

Finally, it looks like the mobile telephone operators are looking at improving their network coverage within this region. Here in Duggleby there is no mobile signal and a proposal has been submitted to erect a transmission mast to address the situation whilst providing additional coverage down the Wolds corridor. The design is now less intrusive than in the past when such proposals would have met resistance from local residents, however, my opinion is that in today's connected world, good mobile reception is to be welcomed.
