Janet Waggot who held the post of Chief Executive for Ryedale District Council has now left to become the Chief Executive for Selby District Council and assistant Chief executive for North Yorkshire County council. Clare Slater who was her deputy has been appointed as the Interim Chief Executive and Head of Paid Service for Ryedale District Council while a recruitment search is undertaken to appoint a candidate on a permanent basis.

There are various projects in progress, one of them being a study to see whether Ryedale House is still suitable for Ryedale District Council following the recent transformation phase which resulted in a reduction in the size of the council or whether smaller premises might be more suitable. Highways have announced a programme of road improvements for the A64 over the next few months so be aware of potential delays.

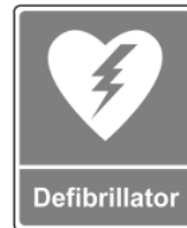

Defibrillators for Foxholes and Butterwick - Training Session

You may have noticed defibrillators have been installed over the summer at Scruton's Foundry Foxholes, and Bannisters Farm Shop, Butterwick. These defibrillators could provide a life saving resource for local residents and have been purchased by Foxholes and Butterwick Parish Council with the aid of generous donations from the George Bairstow Charitable Trust, Wilfred Scruton Ltd, B&F Potatoes and T Bannister. The Parish Council would also like to thank Mr. Exley a local electrician from Foxholes for kindly installing the defibrillators on the sites.

A session has been arranged with Yorkshire Ambulance Services to give training on using the defibrillators and some basic first aid advice, and residents from Foxholes and Butterwick are very welcome to attend the training.

The training will take place in Foxholes Community Hall on Tuesday 17th October 2017 at 7.30pm.

Ryedale Carers Support is currently looking for volunteer

sitters for their resitting service - Particularly those able to volunteer in the Sherburn, Rillington and Wolds area. The service has proven to be a lifeline for many local people. A volunteer sitter provides companionship for one or two hours a week or fortnight, which enables a carer to go out and visit friends, continue with a hobby or simply catch up on some much needed rest.

The charity's sitting service is free for carers as it is delivered by a team of dedicated volunteers, many of whom have been volunteering for the service for a number of years. The volunteers provide companionship but don't provide any medical or personal care - Their role is simply to provide friendly, supportive company and all travel expenses are met by the charity.

The charity welcomes people of any age, from all backgrounds, who can spare a couple of hours a week or fortnight to give a carer some much needed time for themselves.

'Without our fantastic volunteers we would not be able to provide this service,' says Sarah Lally-Marley, the charity's Community Development Worker, 'You can never underestimate the impact a volunteer can have on a carer's life.'

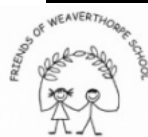
