## A View from Ryedale House



Firstly I would like to wish Warbler readers a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. However, it appears to me that this year, the festivities seem to be quite subdued and perhaps it is just a sign of the times.

Readers may remember a short while ago Ryedale District Council underwent an internal review with the assistance of an appointed external organisation. The purpose was to identify where savings could be made and improved working

practices implemented to lower the council's running costs and improving efficiencies and service standards.

From personal experience, the implementation of the recommended changes has not resulted in the hoped-for improvements. Probably the only area of success has been in lowering the council's running costs through a lower payroll. Many experienced members of staff have left the Ryedale District Council, and have yet to be replaced.

The result, in my opinion, is a decline in the general service standards on offer to the public. Remaining officers and staff are having to cover for colleagues who have left as well as covering their duties with limited resources. An urgent assessment is required to address the current situation. However, with the May elections now on the horizon, it is debatable as to how much can get achieved in the January to March period left for council business.
