The area of North Yorkshire which I represent "Thornton Dale and The Wolds" is one of the largest divisions in the largest county and has the lowest population per acre of the seven districts within NYCC. As such, I am constantly having to fight to ensure all villages and small hamlets have a strong voice and the means to communicate with their elected representatives. I am delighted that after significant lobbying, NYCC have agreed to set up a Rural Commission to look at areas in North Yorkshire which are defined as "sparse" or "super sparse". The Rural Commission will work to improve the evidence base and arguments that will enable local partners to successfully make the case for increased government support to maximise the sustainability of these communities.

Today at the Foxholes Library, I met up with Cllr. Tracie Middleton for coffee and a catch up. We had something of a competition to name the smallest rural community we represent - Binnington, Burdale, Mowthorpe - feel free to join in! However small the community, I am always hugely impressed by the voluntary work that goes on within them and this was definitely the case today at the Foxholes Library. The library has a comprehensive range of books and DVD's which are well referenced. Margaret Atwood's latest novel "The Testament" was featured along with her other novels. But this is much more than a library, as we chatted with residents, local young people were being supported with their homework and young people were helping adults to find their way around the latest technology. A wealth of local information is available and a monthly news letter is being set up to keep us all informed. (See photo on back page).

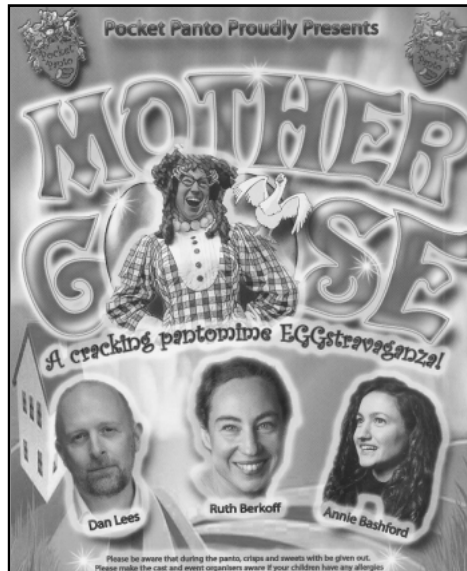

Weaverthorpe Community Speedwatch

30 The Community Speedwatch team continues to monitor the speed of vehicles through our village to help keep our village safer for all residents. We have been operating now for three years. As we have reported to residents the scheme has helped to reduce speeds through the village, but disappointingly over recent months we have seen an increase in the percentage of drivers ignoring the speed limit. Analysis of the deployments over the months of July and August show an average of 14% of drivers over the limit, too many of those travelling at speeds well in excess of 40 mph. We have recently had two of our team move on due other commitments and would like to welcome new volunteers to the team. If you share the view that traffic is travelling too fast through our village and would like to give 2 to 3 hours per month to help to get the message to drivers to slow down, we would welcome your valuable time. Training will be given.
