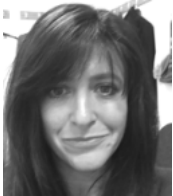

healthwatch

WHAT THREE WORDS

What Three Words is a website that has labelled every 3m x 3m square in the world with an address made of three random words from the dictionary. For example, the 3 word address of Nelson's Column in Trafalgar Square is ///this.fantastic.notes

This is a very useful way of letting people know how to find an exact location whether it is a public place, venue or even your house. Some examples are below:

- Reporting the exact location of crimes/incidents to the Emergency Services and local authorities in your area (North Yorkshire Police and North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue are all set up to accept a 3-word address on a 999 call)
- Listing a 3-word address on signs and websites to help people find local points of interest and attractions-
- Encourage people to use 3-word addresses to help guests find self-catering/ holiday cottages (eg sending them out on Airbnb / Tripadvisor bookings etc)

What Three Words have put together loads of resources to help explain what3words, including images, copy for social media posts, leaflets and posters. You can find them all in this folder: <https://drive.google.com/drive/u/0/folders/1h-lw7TFwHLL-zn-UMm3bLo2sCgnfQ5Fj>

Using what3words:

- North Yorkshire Police and North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue are now using what3words. This means if you get into an accident and are having trouble describing where you are (if you're out walking, for example), you can use the app to tell them your exact location.
- This app was used recently to help a rescue team locate three people who got lost walking in Hamsterley Forest, County Durham.
- All you need to do is download the free what3words app. You'll be able to see and share the 3-word address of your current location and also to find out the 3-word address of your home (by typing in your address and selecting the square containing your front door). If you're renting your property on Airbnb or any other accommodation sites, you can also use it to make sure guests don't get lost by just sending them the 3-word address of the front door/property entrance (especially if your postcode goes to the wrong place!).

Ryedale Community Transport Demand Responsive Transport for Ryedale

As the foremost provider of accessible transport within Ryedale we are keen to assist in any way we can in providing solutions to the community who are struggling with transport. As many of you are aware, many areas of Ryedale have sparse or no public transport provision. We are endeavouring to establish the need for demand responsive transport that people could use within the district.

Our aim is to radically enhance the provision of accessible transport within the entire District of Ryedale. We have called the proposed scheme The Ryedale Rover Service.

We want to operate at least 2 eight-seat

passenger vehicles, which would provide a demand responsive pre-booked service five days a week with a single vehicle operating on Saturday's. The vehicles would be allocated a formal pre-determined route, but by the very nature of the district they would be far more flexible than a registered bus service and allow our booking team to tailor the journey to the needs of the community.
