## A View from County Hall



As I write, storm Dennis is wreaking destruction all over the country apart from here in sunny Thornton Le Dale where amazingly the sky is blue and Dennis is behaving like a real gentleman. Living at the side of the beck, I am always conscious of the damage water can inflict, and take my duties as a riparian owner very seriously because prevention is always better than cure. Climate change is clearly the current hot topic and we have recognised the need to have emergency planning in place to enable us to baton down the hatches should the worst happen.

As a council, NYCC have set up a working group on climate change and we are going to try to get near to being carbon neutral within the next 10 years. This will be a really difficult challenge to meet but we feel we need to demonstrate an enormous ambition because of the sense of urgency that exists on this subject. The carbon footprint of the County Council has been estimated at 13,500 of CO2 emissions per year. This is a huge figure but not surprising given that we are a big council covering a very large rural area, have a large property estate, street lights, transport fleet and essential service contracts.

Some initiatives are already in place to reduce our impact. For example, we are changing all of our street lights to low energy LEDs after reducing the time they're on. We know there is more to do, we are looking at developing solar farms, buying green electricity from renewable sources, replacing heating systems in buildings, making changes to vehicles used to provide home school transport and investing in projects to offset our carbon emissions including planting trees and the restoration of peat land. We are well aware that our thinking needs to develop and welcome ideas but at the same time of course we've got important services to deliver and funding constraints to work within.

My concluding message is to reassure you that as a council we are taking climate change seriously, our probable failing is that we are not shouting about it from the roof to ps!
